We are always delighted when your child wants to bring in a book or artefact that links to our topics, but politely request that no personal toys are brought into school.

<p>English</p> 	<p>During our English lessons we will use a range of fiction and non-fiction texts which will support our topics and be a stimulus for reading, writing, speaking and listening. When writing, we will be focussing on correct letter formation and developing a neat handwriting style. We will have a daily phonics focus and will be looking at spelling patterns to support writing and reading development. The children will be encouraged to develop their own ideas for writing alongside lessons to develop their grammar skills. They will also be using information texts to support their topic work.</p>
<p>Mathematics</p> 	<p>In maths lessons we will focus on number bonds, counting forwards and backwards, partitioning (splitting) numbers and making calculations. All children will also be securing number facts and exploring shape. Pupils will extend their understanding of data handling by processing, presenting and interpreting data.</p>
<p>Science</p> 	<p>In science, this half term, we will be starting our ongoing topic exploring seasonal changes. Each class will be creating a Seasons table and we welcome any objects of interest relating to Autumn. We will be making regular recordings of changes in weather and charting these over time. In addition, the children will be learning about an animal very specific to Cumbria, the Herdwick sheep, and thinking about how this animal survives on the fells. We will also be finding out about wool and the history of Kendal.</p>
<p>ICT and Computing</p> 	<p>The children will have the opportunity to use the new laptops in the ICT suite once a week where they can practise and develop their skills. We also have class computers and a class set of ipads which are used to support the curriculum. The focus this half term will be using child safe search engines such www.kidrex.org to find information and also how to use Bing/Google Maps to locate places in Kendal.</p>



<p>History</p> 	<p>In our history unit this half term, pupils will be learning about the history of Kendal. We will be looking at the meaning behind the Kendal coat of arms, learning about the castle and the wool trade. We hope that by the end of this topic the children will have a greater understanding of the town in which they live.</p>
<p>Geography</p> 	<p>On the 23rd September, as part of our Africa Theme Fortnight, we have a group of Maasai Warriors visiting school. The children will learn about their traditions and customs, and also find out about Kenya and Tanzania which is home to the Maasai people.</p>
<p>Art and Design Technology</p> 	<p>Our artwork, this half term, will be linked to our topics and the children will have the opportunity to use a range of materials such as paint, clay and textiles to create a range of pictures and models.</p>
<p>Music</p> 	<p>In our weekly singing session in Key Stage One, the children will be learning songs about starting back at school, Autumnal changes and songs that reinforce personal and social aspects of learning.</p>
<p>PE</p> 	<p>The children have one indoor and one outdoor P.E. session each week. The indoor session will focus on developing floor skills such as jumping, travelling and balancing. The outdoor session will focus on passing and receiving an object, such as a ball, using hands, feet, bats and hockey sticks.</p>
<p>RE</p> 	<p>This half term we will be exploring what different people believe about the creation of our world. We will be thinking about what stories say about God as the Creator. We will also be learning about how Harvest is celebrated and hope to visit Rev. Jean Radley at St. George's Church following the Harvest Festival.</p>
<p>Global Awareness</p> 	<p>Our Global Awareness curriculum will focus on valuing similarities and differences in people from different cultures and learning about lifestyles, traditions and customs that are unfamiliar to us.</p>
<p>Citizenship</p> 	<p>Our citizenship sessions will focus on settling back to school and remembering the school rules. The children will also be thinking and talking about issues surrounding friendships.</p>
<p>Homework Ideas</p> 	<p>Here are some ideas to support your child at home:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily reading (school books or home books) • Writing (stories, diaries, recounts, book reviews) • Cooking (reading instructions, weighing and measuring) • Shopping (using coins and getting change) • Telling the time • Looking at maps and finding out about different countries. • Going for a walk and looking for signs of Autumn.



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
