<p>English</p> 	<p>During our English lessons we will use a range of fiction and non-fiction texts to support our topics, and be a stimulus for reading, writing, speaking and listening. Specifically we will working on writing simple, correctly punctuated sentences with increasing independence, remembering capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. We will be retelling familiar stories, and using first hand experiences to write for different purposes. We will also be reading, enjoying and writing poetry, and identifying personal preferences. We will continue to teach the correct formation of letters, through regular handwriting practise. Our daily phonics sessions will look at a range of spelling patterns to support writing and reading development.</p>
<p>Mathematics</p> 	<p>In mathematics, we will continue to work on counting in a range of sequences and practising our 'Learn Its' during our 'Big Maths' sessions. We will be learning how to solve addition and subtraction calculations in a range of ways e.g. practical, with numbers lines and using numicon. We will also be learning the names of properties of 2D and 3D shapes, as well as working on practical activities using different measures e.g. length and weight.</p>
<p>Science</p> 	<p>In science, this half term, we will continue our ongoing topic exploring seasonal changes. We will be using our school grounds to identify a wide range of common trees by looking carefully at their leaves, bark, berries and seeds. In addition, the children will be learning how to ask questions about the world around them, and how to carry out a simple investigation fairly by controlling the variables.</p>
<p>ICT and Computing</p> 	<p>The children will have the opportunity to use the new laptops in the IT suite once a week where they can practise and develop their skills. We also have class computers and a class set of ipads which are used to support the curriculum. This half term we will continue to use child safe search engines such www.kidrex.org to find information and also how to use Bing/Google Maps to locate places in Kendal.</p>
<p>History</p> 	<p>In our history unit this half term, pupils will continue to learn about the history of Kendal. We will be looking at the meaning behind the Kendal coat of arms, learning about the castle and the wool trade. We hope that by the end of this topic the children will have a greater understanding of the town in which they live.</p> <p>This half term, we will be learning about Remembrance Sunday, and appreciating why people buy and wear poppies at this time of year. We will also be learning about the life of Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot and think about different sources of evidence.</p>
<p>Art and Design Technology</p> 	<p>Our artwork, this half term, will be linked to our topics and the children will have the opportunity to use a range of materials such as paint, clay and textiles to create a range of pictures and models. We also have Christmas 'making morning' to look forward to!</p>
<p>Music</p> 	<p>In our weekly singing sessions in Key Stage One, the children will be learning and performing the songs which form part of our Christmas Nativity Production which will take place in December. As you will have seen from the last newsletter all performances are in the morning this year as the nursery children taking part only attend school in the mornings.</p>

PE 	The children have one indoor and one outdoor P.E. session each week. The indoor session will focus on dance and developing a sequence of moves to music. The outdoor session will focus on passing and receiving an object, such as a ball, using hands, feet, bats and hockey sticks.
RE 	This half term we will thinking about "Celebrations". We will learn about the Hindu and Sikh celebration of Divali and the children will think about special celebrations in their own lives. We will then look at the celebrations linked to Christmas, and the meanings behind the celebrations for Christians.
Global Awareness 	Our Global Awareness curriculum will focus on helping others who are less fortunate than ourselves. We will be talking to the children about the shoebox appeal, and how the lives of children from poorer countries can be enhanced by our gifts.
Citizenship 	Our citizenship sessions will focus on our new school values. This half term we will be thinking about being "Resourceful".
